

The doc KING OF KINGS, directed by Harriet Marin Jones, searches for the truth about her grandfather, Edward Jones, a charismatic African American businessman who rose to the heights of financial and political prominence in Depression-era Chicago before falling into oblivion.

In shaping the destiny of a city, Edward Jones could not, however, escape discrimination. By exploring her family roots, European filmmaker Harriet Marin Jones uncovers more forgotten Black History that ultimately helped to shape this country!

Synopsis

Gangster for some, philanthropist for others, who was really Edward Jones? In the 1930s and 1940s, this descendant of slaves becomes one of the richest men in the United States thanks to the Policy business, an illegal numbers game, that ultimately became the modern state lottery, now played by millions nationwide.

Edward Jones, nicknamed the "King of Kings," amassed a fortune of \$25 million in the Policy business, and redistributed part of that money back into his community, setting an example and opening many doors. But in these times of segregation, his success and unfailing support to the African American community are a problem. In conflict with both the mob and the Feds. he is eventually forced into a life on the run!

Exploring the rise and fall of the most famous Policy King of all times, the filmmaker, Edward Jones's granddaughter, uncovers an unparalleled story, while showing the lasting repercussions of his untold story, both within her family, and for Chicago's South Side where he once embodied the American dream.

HARRIET MARIN JONES

Writer, Producer, Director

Award-Winning Director and Producer, Harriet Marin Jones grew up in different countries in Europe. After studying at Loyola University in Chicago and American University in Washington, D.C. where she received a bachelor's degree in visual media and voted Best Student in the department, she pursued her master's degree in Cinema Studies at New York University. During her studies, Jones wrote and directed a dozen short films that won numerous awards. She started her career as an assistant director on feature films in the United States and France, and began simultaneously evaluating scripts for two major French broadcasters. Marin Jones has written and directed two high-budgets short films, followed by her first feature film, distributed by Gaumont. In addition, she has worked as a script doctor; written two novels, directed a play by Ray Cooney; and co-produced and directed the pilot for France 2. In 2008, she started her own film and TV company, Abelart Productions. In 2017, she created and launched two online-course platforms with a total enrollment of more than 70,000 students. Marin Jones has two children, resides in Paris, has traveled to over 100 countries, and has just finished her third novel. "KING OF KINGS: Chasing Edward Jones" is her first documentary.

Director's Statement

KING OF KINGS takes an in-depth look at the life and legacy of Edward Jones. As his granddaughter, I've had access to countless anecdotes and incredible documents retracing his personal journey in the midst of major historical events. Even though it took me years to do all the research and interviews, as well as find the funds to finance the film, as a filmmaker, I could not have asked for a better story.

Since I have been living most of my life in Europe, making this documentary was not only an amazing personal and professional experience, it also allowed me to plunge into the history of the United States. As Quincy Jones says in the film, "It is so important to know and understand your history, because if you know where you come from, it helps you get where you're going."

Discovering for instance that African Americans were behind the State Lottery and seeing the incredible impact my grandfather had on Chicago were just some of the many eye-opening facts that I came across. Seeing the amazing enthusiastic audience response to the film each time it is being screened makes all this journey worth it. Policy Kings will not fall after all into oblivion.

Executive Producers

Quincy Jones (Executive Producer)

Quincy Jones Jr. is an American record producer, musician, songwriter, composer, arranger, and film and television producer. His career spans 70 years in the entertainment industry with a record of 80 Grammy Award nominations, 28 Grammys, and a Grammy Legend Award.

Debbie Allen (Executive Producer)

Debbie Allen is an award-winning director and choreographer. She has choreographed the Academy Awards a record ten times and directed and choreographed for legendary artists including Michael Jackson. Ms. Allen received the Golden Globe for her role as Lydia Grant in the 1980s hit series Fame and is a three-time Emmy Award winner in Choreography for Fame and The Motown 25th. She has been honored with ten Image Awards as director, actress, choreographer and producer for Fame, A Different World, Motown 25th, The Academy Awards, The Debbie Allen Special and Amistad. Ms. Allen has also directed and produced award-winning network television and currently serves as Executive Producing Director of Grey's Anatomy, where she also holds a recurring role as Catherine Fox. In 2001, she founded the non-profit Debbie Allen Dance Academy in Los Angeles. In 2022, Debbie Allen partnered with Shonda Rhimes to create the Shonda Rhimes Performing Arts Center in Los Angeles. Ms. Allen is a BFA graduate of Howard University in Theater and Classical Greek Studies and is a native of Houston, Texas. She is the daughter of Vivian Ayers and Dr. Andrew Allen, wife to NBA All-Star Norman Nixon.

Stéphane Sperry (Executive Producer)

Stéphane Sperry has a long and impressive track record in the industry. He held top senior positions at CANAL+, Ellipse Studio and Alliance before joining the Federation Entertainment as Co-founder with Pascal Breton in 2013. He is notably known for producing The Adventures of Tintin alongside Steven Spielberg and Peter Jackson, and Assault on Precint 13, starring Ethan Hawke. He began his film industry career, working on nearly three dozen features. He spent three years as President of Alliance International, Canada's foremost film production and distribution company, as well as four years as the head of Island Records (France). Sperry came to Canal Plus in 1987 as the head of the Ellipse Programmes. (Canal + is the most important cable operator in France and a major producer of French films.) Later he was Executive Vice President for programming and strategic development at Studio Canal, then Head of Acquisitions, before becoming Co- President of Canal Plus US operation where he orchestrated investments in films such as Mulholland Drive, Sleepy Hollow or The Pianist.
